Reading over the summer months is shown to improve comprehension skills and test scores. We always encourage students to read for pleasure especially during the summer to continue to develop and nurture a life-long love of reading.

All students entering the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade are required to read the 3 books listed below.

*Arthur's Eyes* by Marc Brown

*Corduroy* by Don Freeman

*Amelia Bedelia* by Peggy Parish

These books have been chosen to stimulate comprehension and critical thinking skills. These skills will be further expanded upon during the course of the school year.

After reading all 3 of the books your child will also need to complete the following 2 projects on 2 of the books. Choose one book to use for each project.

1. DIORAMA: Create a scene from the story inside a shoe box. The box should be placed on its side. Be creative using crayons, clay, construction paper, foam pieces, etc. to create the scene.
2. MOBILE: Draw pictures of at least 3 of the characters from the book. You will also need to write a brief summary of the beginning, the middle and the end of the story. Then attach the pictures and the summaries to a hanger or two sticks criss-crossed to create a hanging mobile of the story!

Both completed projects should be sent in with your child on the first day of school. Have a great summer filled with reading!
