Instructions for preparing supplies

We would greatly appreciate if you would help us in preparing your child's school supplies by following the instructions below.

- If your child has a pencil case, please have them place 2 pencils, 1 eraser, 1 scissors, 1 box of crayons, and 2 glue sticks inside. Each item should be labeled with their name. If your child does not have a pencil case, they may place those items inside a Ziploc bag also labeled with their name. Place the extra pencils, crayons, glue sticks erasers and scissors inside a separate Ziploc bag labeled with your child's name.
- Four of your child's folders should be labeled. The first one should be labeled as "Homework", the second one as "Spanish", the third one as "Journal" and the fourth as "Seatwork". On the inside of the **homework** folder please label the left side with a big smiley face and the words "Keep Home" and label the right side as "Return".
- All other supplies such as tissues, boxes of Ziploc bags, composition notebooks, etc. may be placed in another bag.

Please make sure **EVERYTHING IS LABELED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME!**
