

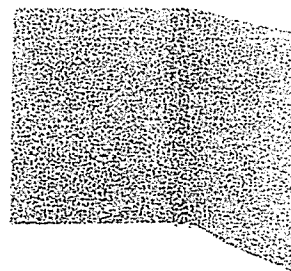

Dear Families,

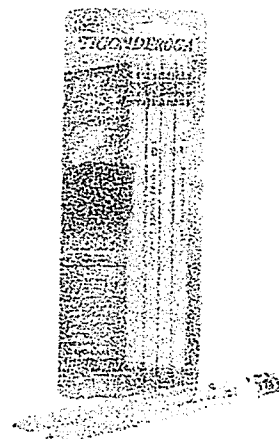
The Kindergarten teachers have made a list of supplies that your child will need to start the school year. These items are designed to promote organization and to develop good independent work habits. As part of our class community, the students learn to cooperate together and share materials as a class. The only items that need to be labeled with your child's name are: smock apron, erasers, crayons, scissors, Elmer liquid glue, and folders. Your child should bring in his/her school supplies the first day of school.

2. Read any book by author Eric Carle with your child. Pay special attention to the colors and textures visible in the illustrations. Let your child make a collage or illustration about the book using at least 6 colors.
3. Pick and read one book from the suggested reading list below and complete a book report sheet for this book. You may choose between book report option 1 or option 2 depending on your child's reading and writing level.



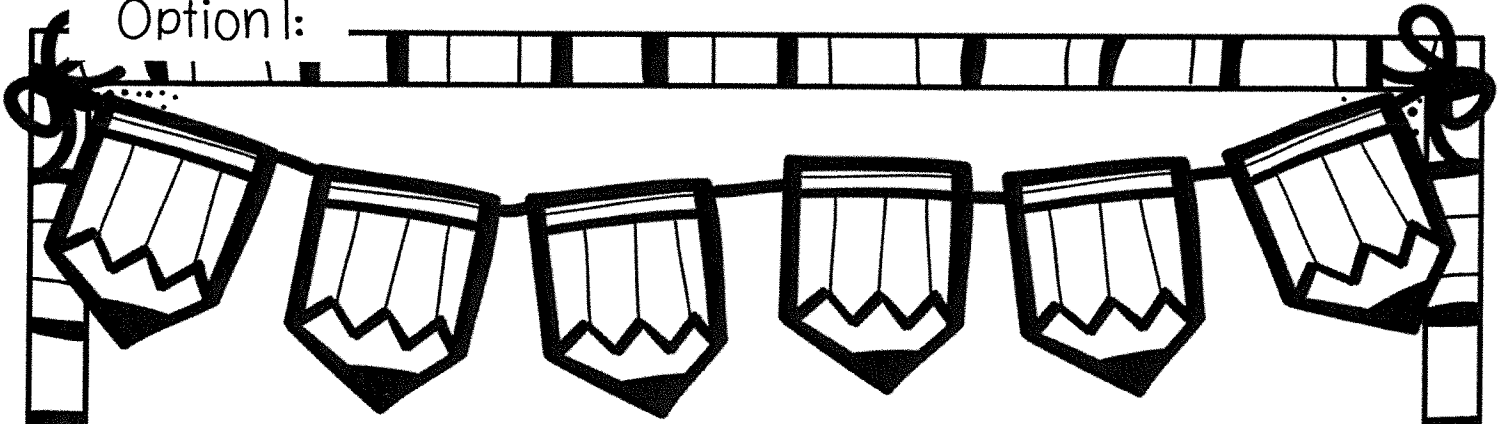

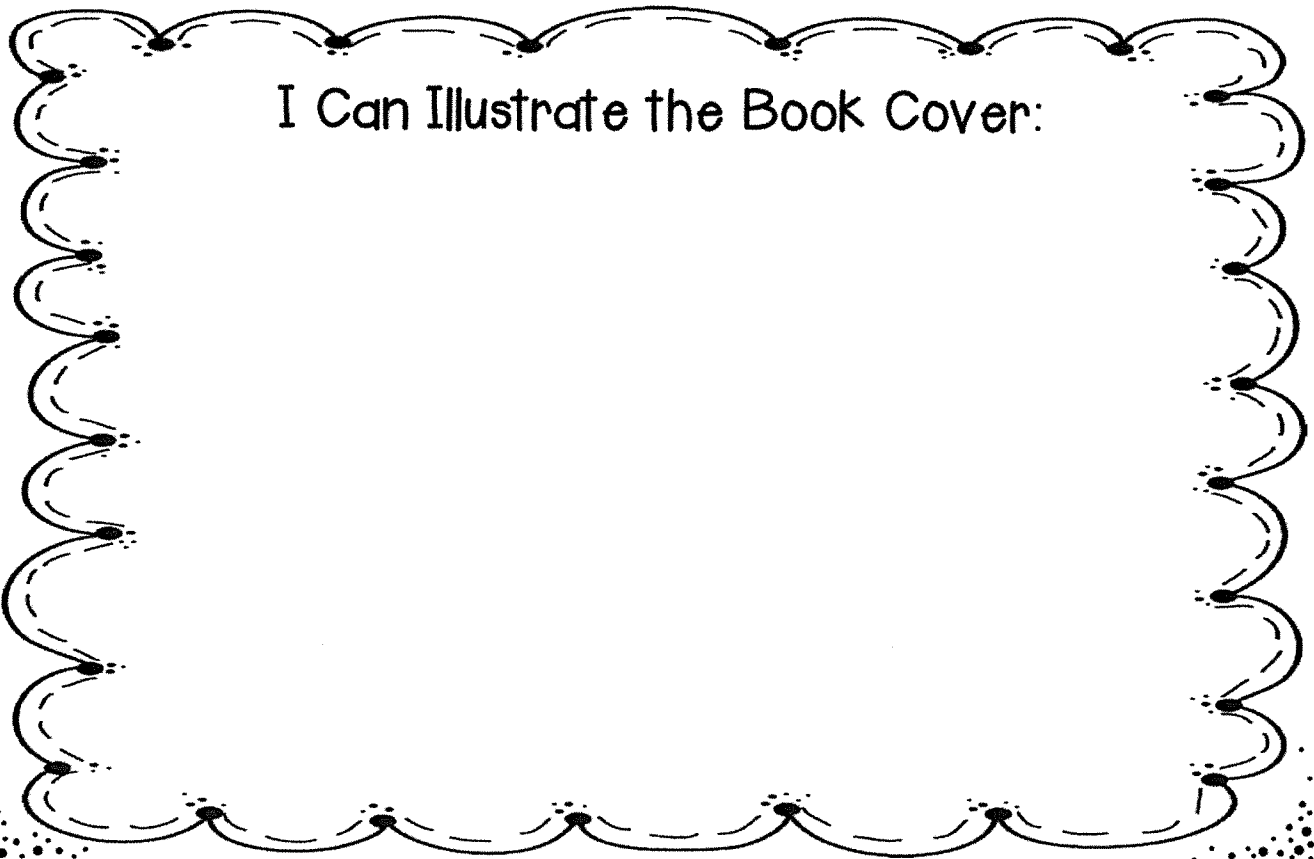
